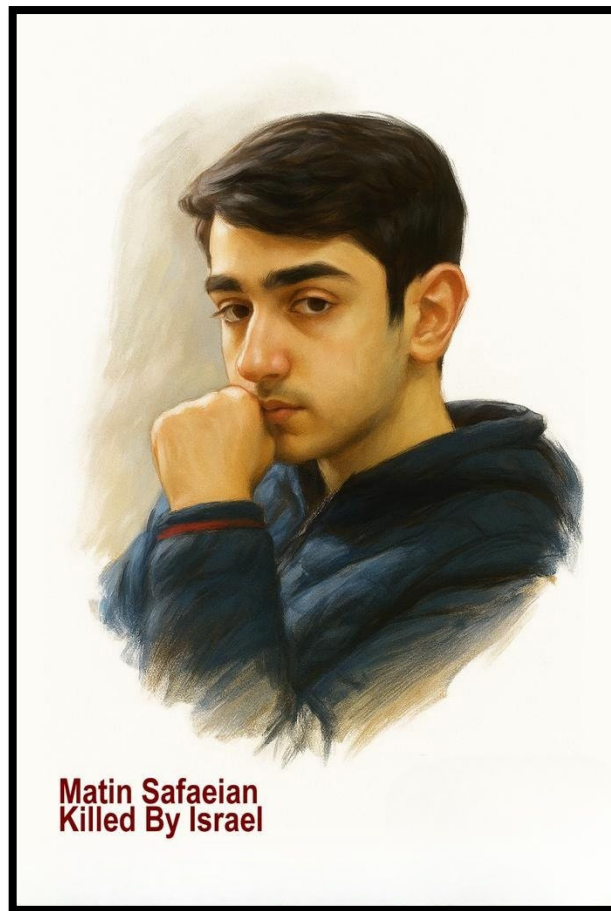


On 13 June 2025, Israel launched a series of coordinated military strikes against Iranian territory, marking a blatant act of aggression and a grave violation of international law. These attacks occurred in the broader context of Israel's ongoing military operations in Gaza, which have already led to tens of thousands of civilian deaths, and now have expanded to target Iran directly. By violating the prohibition on the use of force enshrined in Article 2(4) of the UN Charter, Israel has further undermined the United Nations' mandate to maintain international peace and security. These actions are particularly egregious, as they coincided with Iran's active pursuit of diplomatic solutions to uphold its rights under international law, in accordance with the principle of peaceful dispute settlement under Article 2(3) of the UN Charter.

In accordance with para. 70 of General Comment No. 36, Israel's blatant violation of the peremptory norm prohibiting the use of force in international relations, and its clear posture as the aggressor in this conflict, render every deprivation of life attributable to it an *ipso facto* violation of international human rights law, in particular Article 6 of the ICCPR. This conclusion, however, in no way absolves Israel of its binding obligations under international humanitarian law. Pursuant to customary international law, codified in Article 48 of Additional Protocol I to the Geneva Conventions, Israel is bound by the principle of distinction, which mandates that: "the Parties to the conflict shall at all times distinguish between the civilian population and combatants and between civilian objects and military objectives and accordingly shall direct their operations only against military objectives". Contrary to these binding obligations under IHL, Israel has repeatedly and deliberately targeted civilians and civilian infrastructure. According to the Iranian Ministry of Health, Israel's attacks have claimed at least 1,062 lives, including 45 children, 126 women, 4 Iranian Red Crescent paramedics, and 13 university professors, while leaving more than 5,600 others injured. In their joint statement of 20 June 2025, the United Nations Special Rapporteurs characterized these killings—including civilian scientists, paramedics, military commanders, and public officials—as *extrajudicial executions*, acts expressly prohibited under international human rights law. Their assessment highlights the gravity of these violations and the urgent need for accountability under established international legal frameworks

Now, we turn our gaze to images of lives forever lost. Behind each number lies a vanished world: a child who will never grow, a mother who will never again embrace her family, a medic who rushed to save lives but never returned, a teacher whose voice will no longer resonate in a classroom. Every figure represents a stolen story, a silenced heartbeat, a life tragically cut short.

In the images that follow, these are not mere statistics but people—fathers, daughters, friends, and colleagues—whose absence leaves an eternal void. These images serve as a solemn tribute to lives that each carried a universe of love, hope, and dreams, now preserved only in memory.



Document No. 1

Title: The Killing of **Matin Safaian**

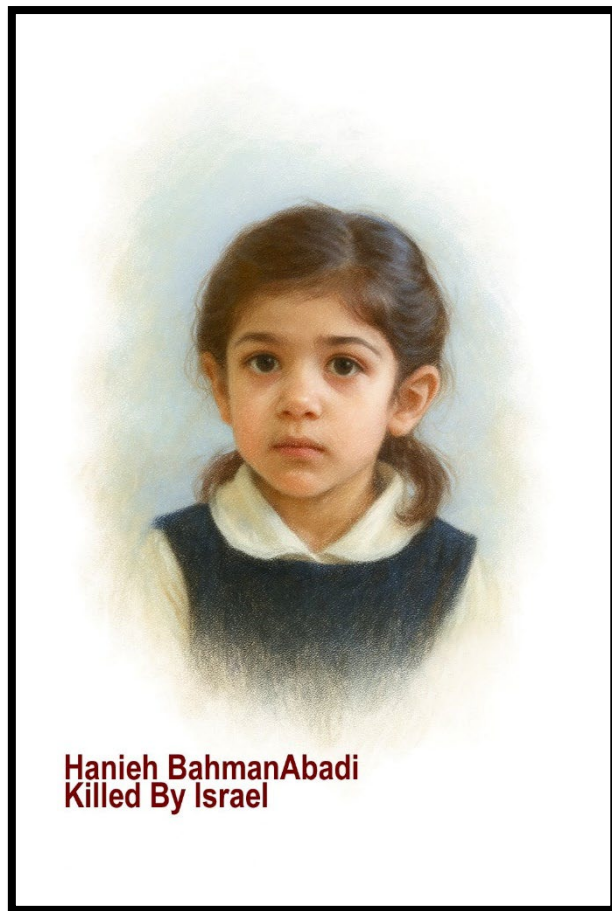
Description of the incident: Matin Safaian, a 16-year-old student at Sadr High School in Tehran, was walking near Tajrish Square when he was killed in the brutal Israeli attacks. He was neither in the memorial nor in the security meetings. He was only present in the city square.

Title: The Killing of **Mahya Nikzad**

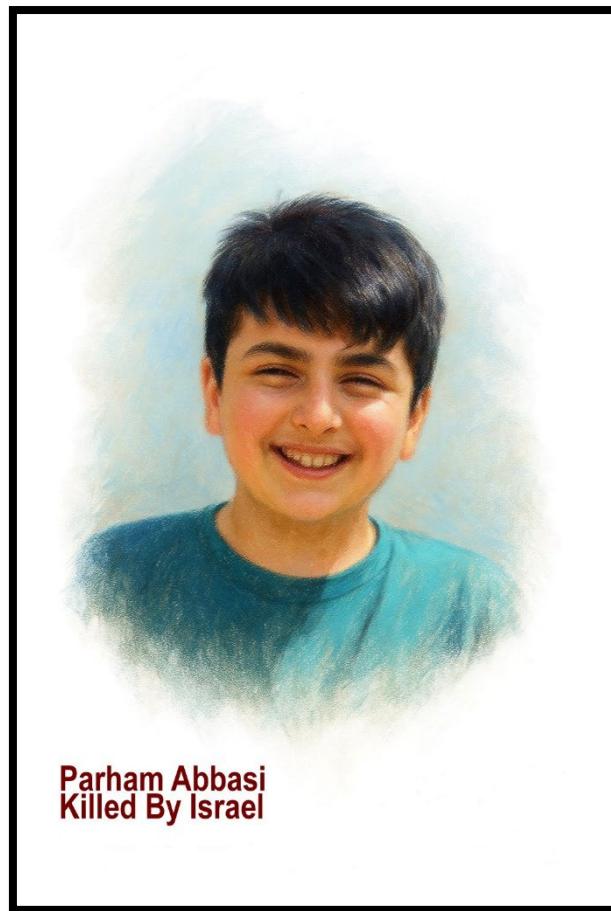
Description of the incident: Mahya Nikzad, a 7-year-old student, was martyred due to the bombing of residential areas, despite the Zionist regime's claim of avoiding attacks on civilians.

Title: The Killing of **Hanieh Bahmanabadi**

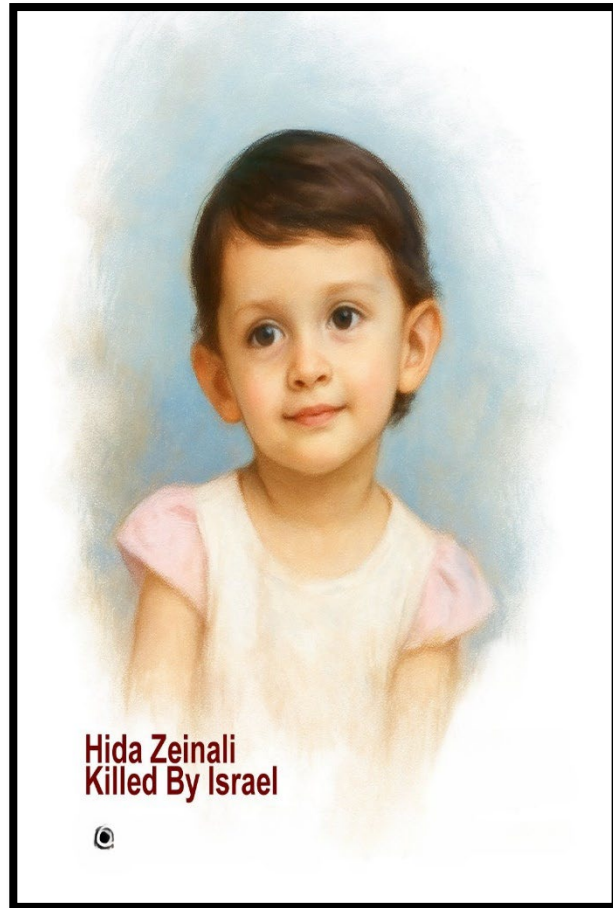
Description of the incident: Hanieh Bahmanabadi, a young child who was martyred in the Zionist regime's attack on civilian areas.

Title: The Killing of **Parham Abbasi**

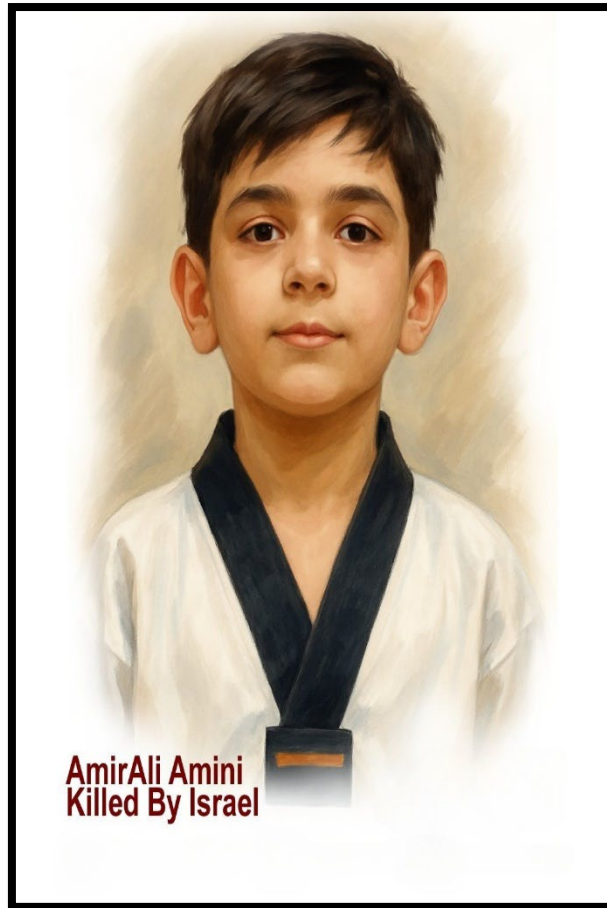
Description of the incident: Parham Abbasi, a 14-year-old teenager who was killed along with his sister Parnia in Israeli attacks on civilian areas.

Title: The Killing of of Heyda Zeynali

Description of the incident: A young child who was unlawfully killed alongside her father and little sister during the attacks by the Israeli regime on residential areas, constituting a war crime.

Title: The Killing of Amir Ali Amini

Description of the incident: A 12-year-old taekwondo student was killed along with his father in an Israeli attack on the Mahallati area of Tehran. The teenager's body was identified by his uncle using a DNA test.

Title: The Killing of Alisan Jabari

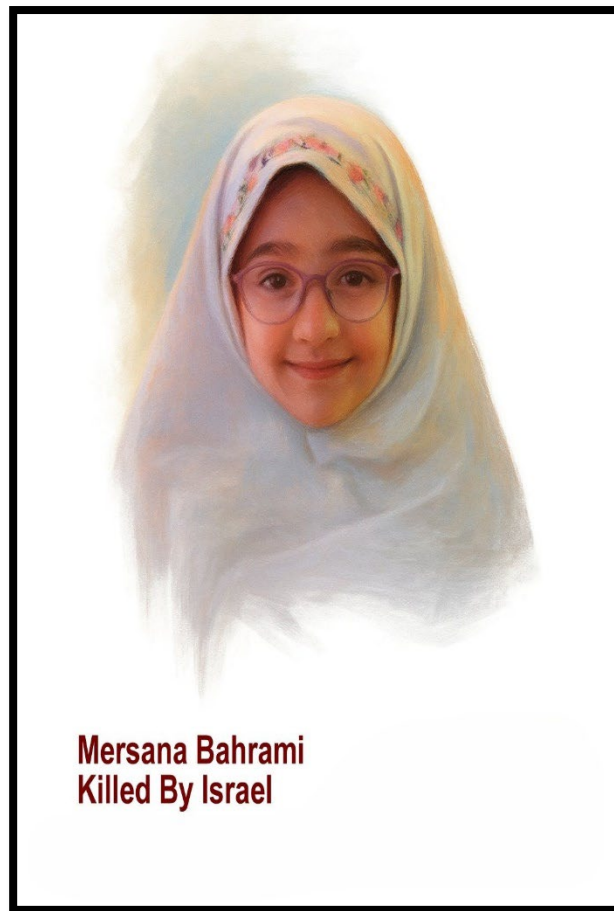
Description of the incident: A 7-year-old student who had just completed the first grade of elementary school was martyred along with his playmate Taha Behrouzi in an attack by the Israeli regime on residential areas.

Title: The Killing of Sarvin Hamidian

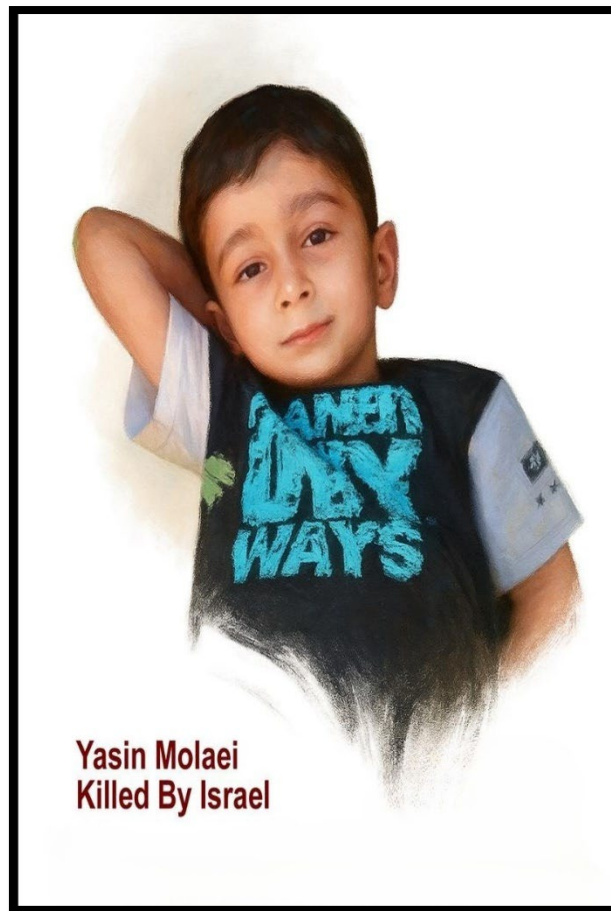
Description of the incident: Sarvin Hamidian, a young child, was killed together with her mother, Hadis Farari (a staff member of the Social Security Organization), due to the bombing of residential areas by the Zionist regime.

Title: The Killing of Marsana Bahrami

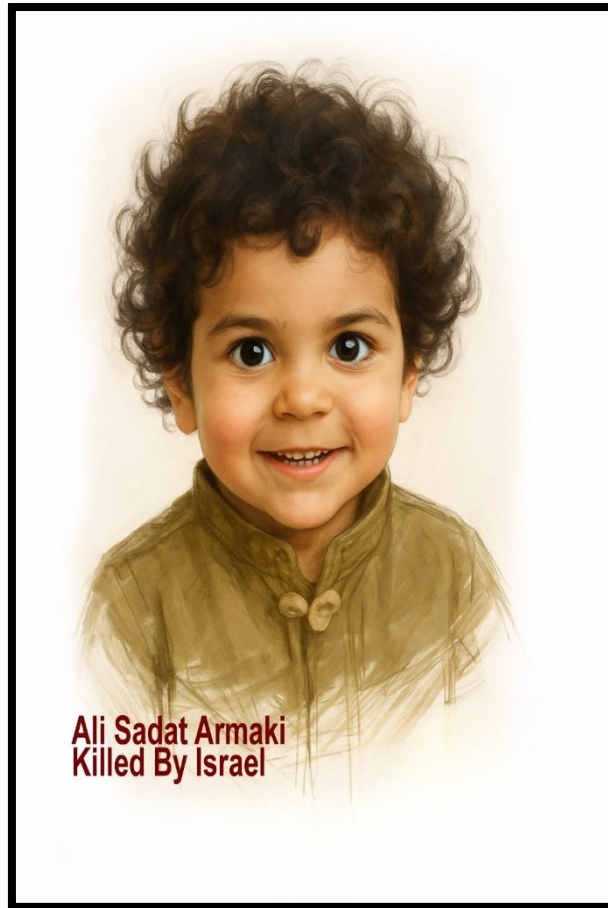
Description of the incident: Martyr Ruhollah Bahrami, Martyr Behjat Saadian, and Martyr Marsana Bahrami, all from the same family, were martyred in this attack in Tehran.

Title: The Killing of Yasin Molaei

Description of the incident: Following a Zionist airstrike targeting a civilian vehicle on the Hamil-Besarbe road, a mother and her 6-year-old child, Yasin Molaei, were unlawfully killed, while the father and their other child were seriously injured and transferred to medical facilities.

Title: The Killing of Ali Sadati Armaki

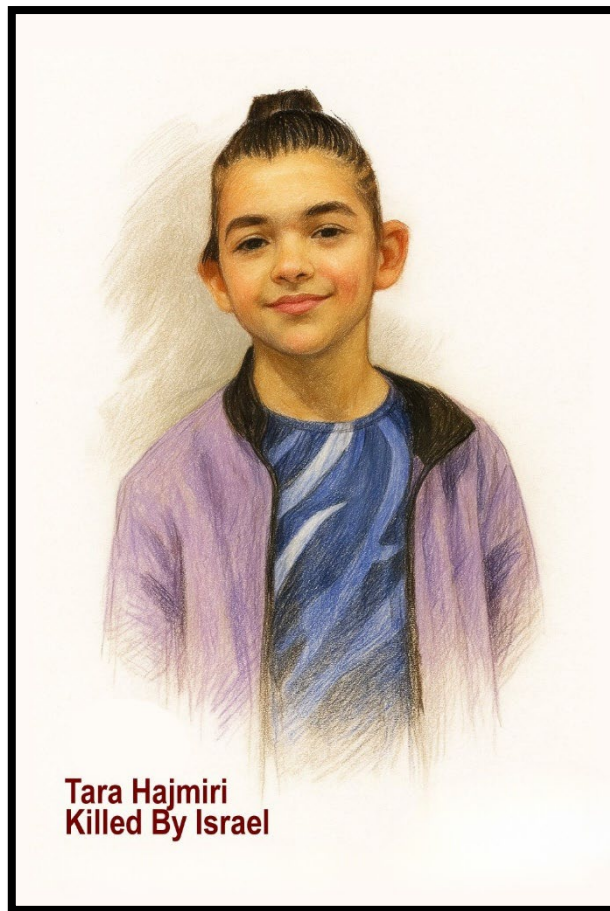
Description of the incident: Seyed Mostafa Sadati Armaki, a national scientific elite and nuclear scientist from Armak village, Kashan, together with his wife Fahimeh Moghimi, their three children Ali, Fatemeh, and Reyhaneh Sadati Armaki, and his wife's parents, were martyred in Israeli attacks in Tehran.

Title: The Killing of Soheil Katouli

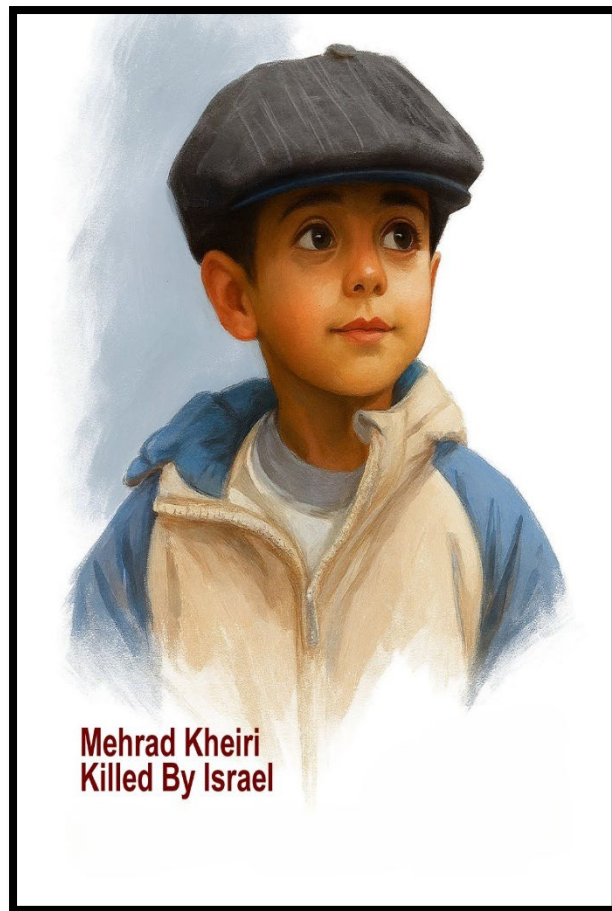
Description of the incident: An 11-year-old boy was martyred alongside his mother, Sona Haghighi, during missile attacks carried out by the Zionist regime.

Title: The Killing of Tara Haji Miri

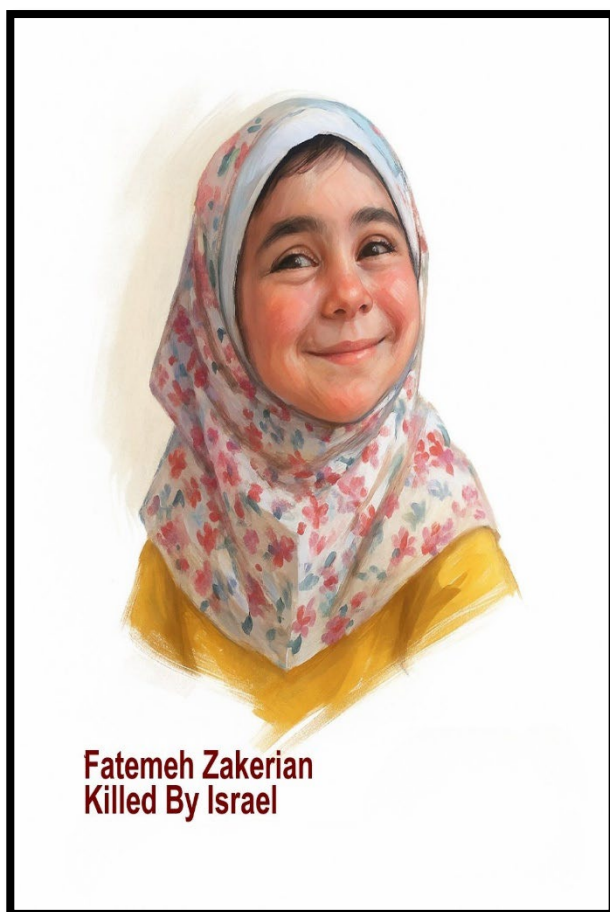
Description of the incident: An 8-year-old girl who had just entered the world of gymnastics was killed—along with her mother and father—in a missile strike by the Zionist regime on District 2 of Tehran.

Title: The Killing of Mehrad Kheiri

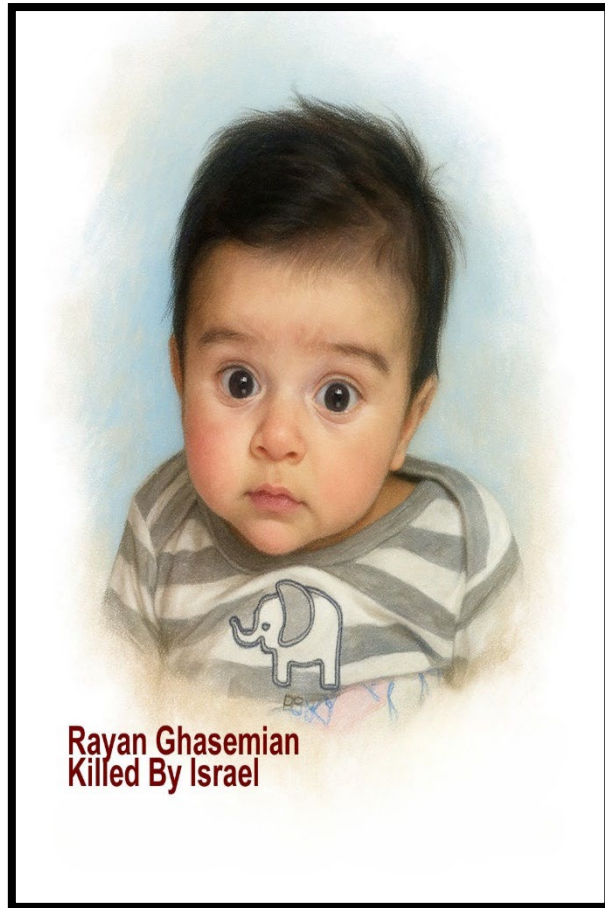
Description of the incident: A five-year-old child who, due to the closure of the kindergarten, was present alongside his mother Zahra Ebadi, a social worker at Evin Prison, was martyred as a result of Israel's attack on this prison.

Description of the incident: Members of a single family were martyred, including two young girls aged 7 months and 5 years.

Title: The Killing of Rayan Ghasemian

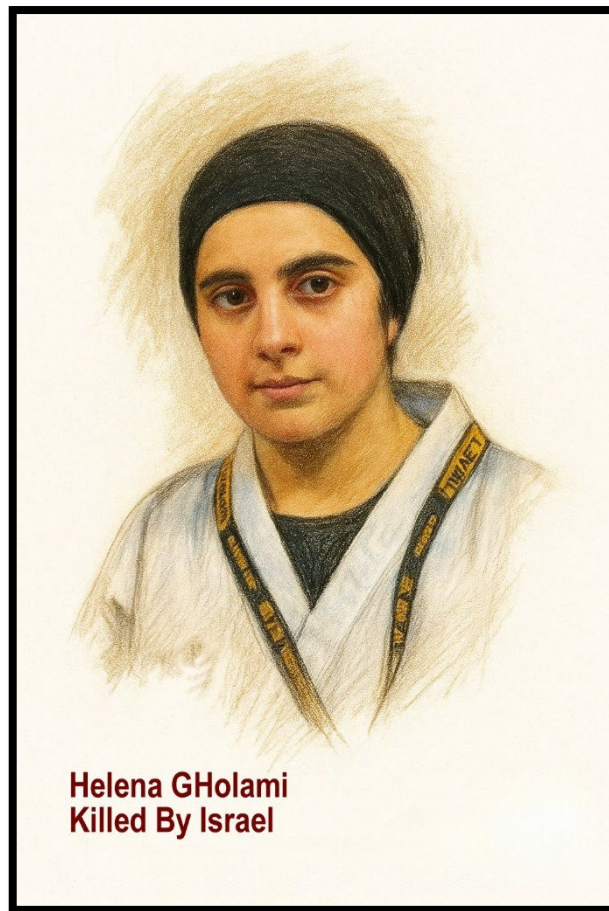

Title: The Killing of Taha Behroozi

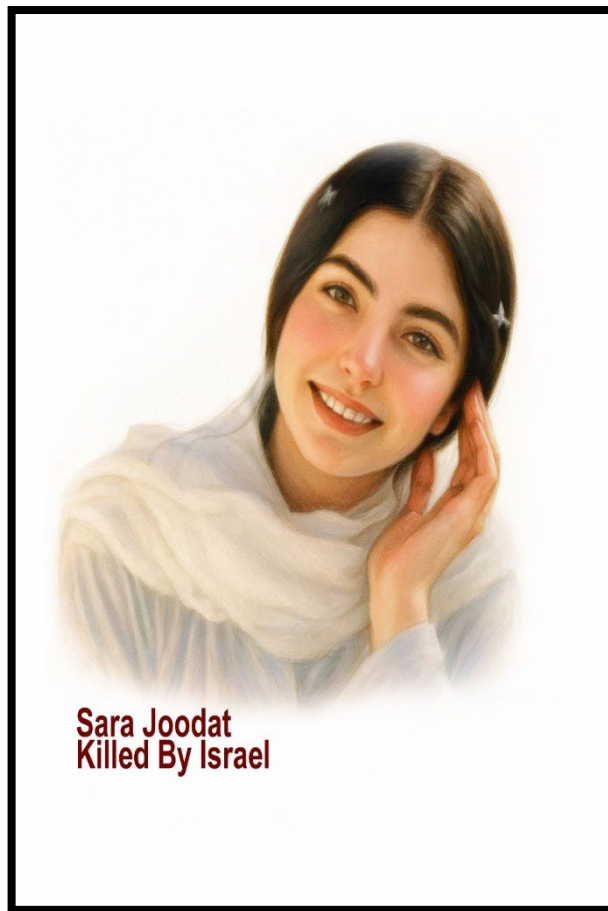
Description of the incident: A 7-year-old child, who had just been registered for first grade, was martyred at the hands of the Zionist regime.

Title: The Killing of Helena Gholami

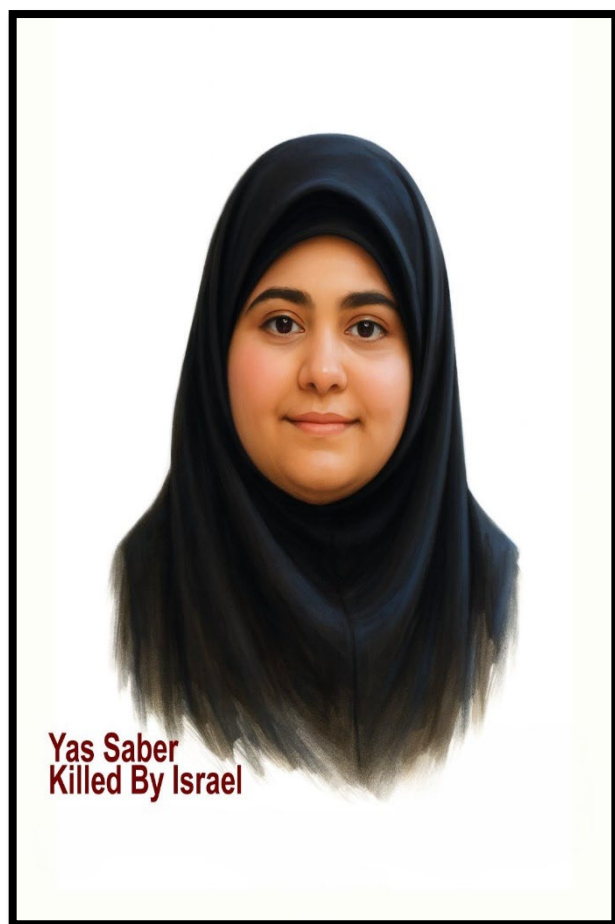
Description of the incident: A 12-year-old teenager who was an Asian championship medalist, now also bears the title of “martyr” alongside her name and achievements.

Title: The Killing of Sara Jodat

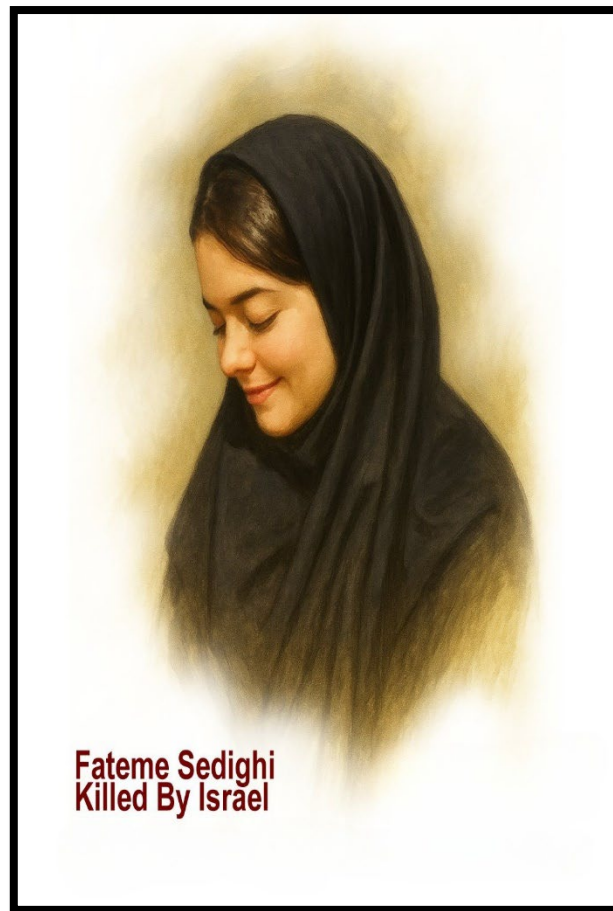

Title: The Killing of Yas Saber

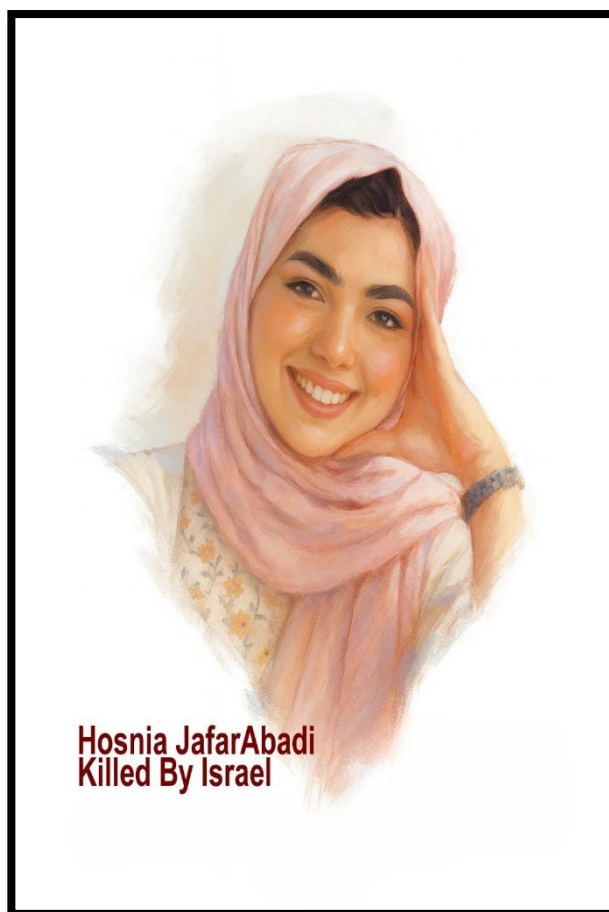
Description of the incident: Yas Saber, only fourteen years old, was martyred during a Zionist regime attack targeting nuclear scientist Mohammad Reza Sedighi Saber, the husband of her sister.

Title: The Killing of Fateme SedighiSaber

Description of the incident: The daughter of Mohammad-Reza Sedighi Saber, a nuclear scientist who was killed along with 11 relatives in the Israeli attack of June 23, moved to Astaneh Ashrafieh and stayed at her grandfather's house after losing her 17-year-old brother, Hamid-Reza. But the fire reached them there as well, and this time she, her younger sister Mahya, her mother and father, and several other relatives were killed.

Title: The Killing of Hosniyeh Jafarabadi

Description of the incident: Hosniyeh Jafarabadi, an intern and final-year PhD candidate in veterinary medicine (class of 2018) at the Islamic Azad University, Karaj Branch, was deliberately targeted and killed, along with her husband, at their home in Tehran.

Title: The Killing of Parsa Mansour

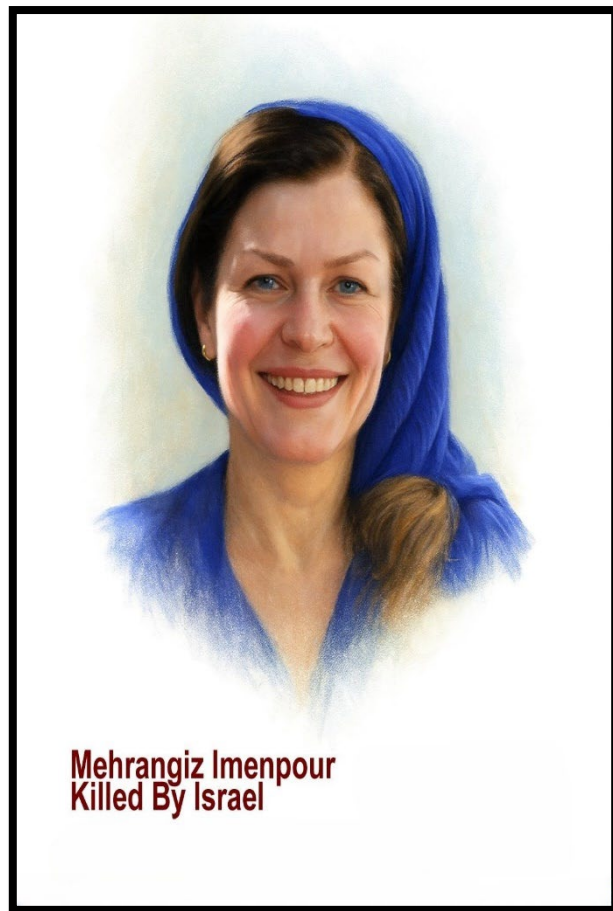
Description of the incident: A rocket, launched with the aim of assassinating a nuclear scientist, struck a house in a residential area of Tehran. This indiscriminate attack not only failed to hit its intended target but also destroyed the life of an innocent family. In the strike, Parsa Mansour Hezar Jeribi—a 26-year-old conscript in the Iranian army—was killed while sleeping.

Title: The Killing of Masoumeh Shahriari

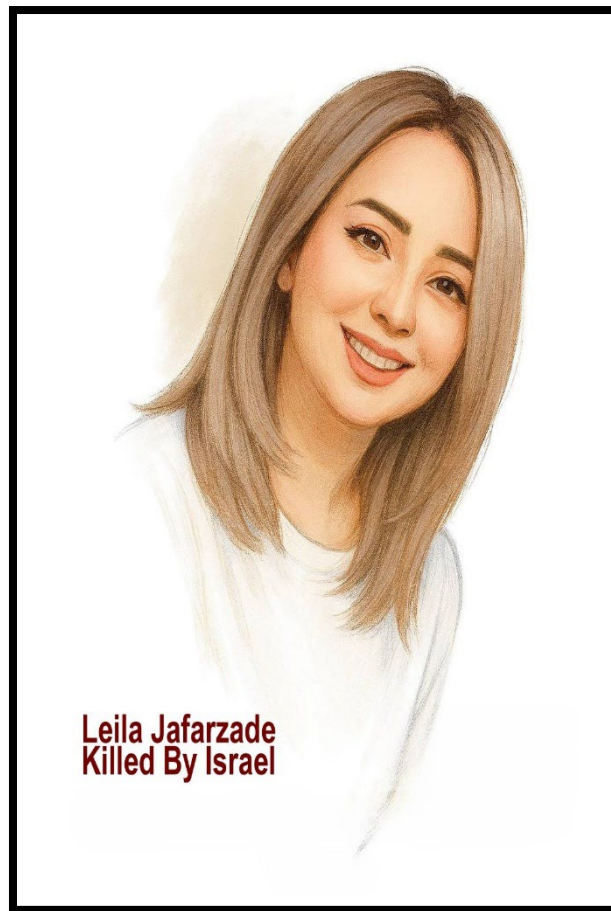

Title: The Killing of Mehrangiz Aymanpour

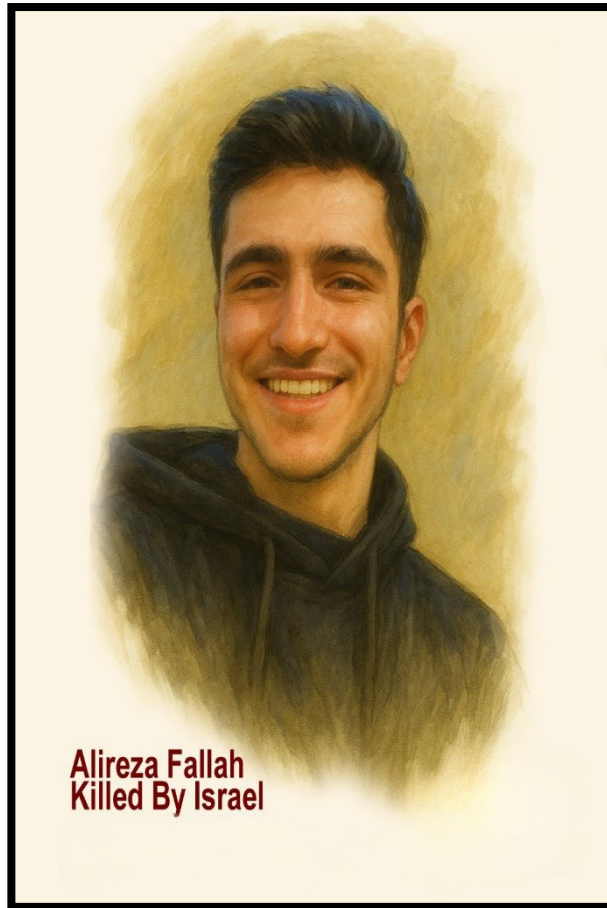

Title: The Killing of Leila Jafarzadeh

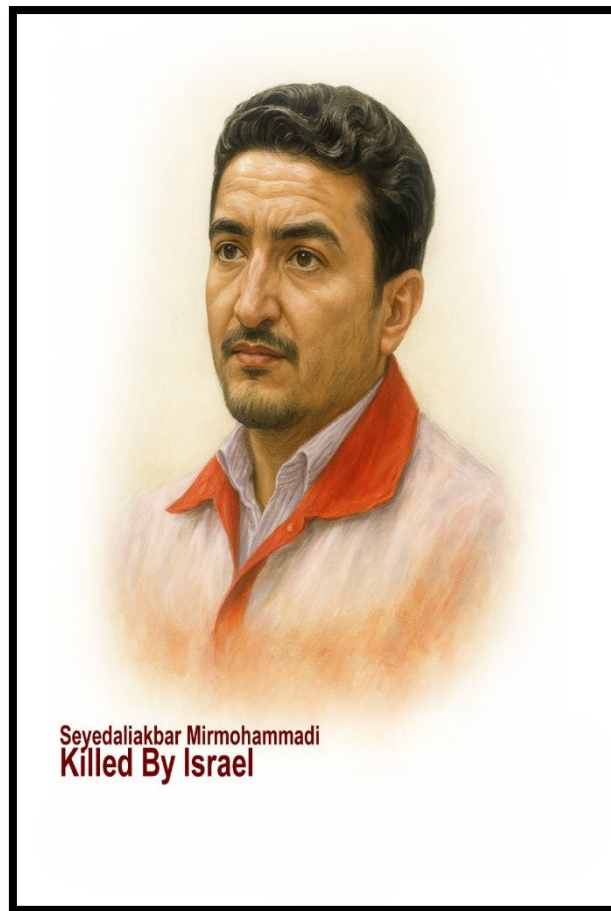

Title: The Killing of Alireza Fallah

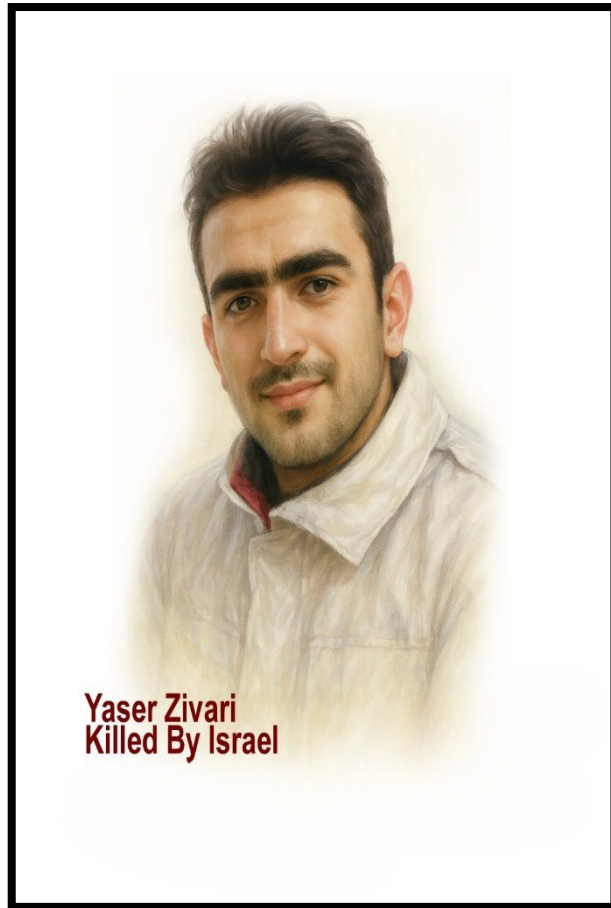
Description of the incident: A 25-year-old soldier of the homeland was martyred during an attack by the Zionist regime in the city of Tehran.

Title: The Killing of AliAkbar Mirmohammadi

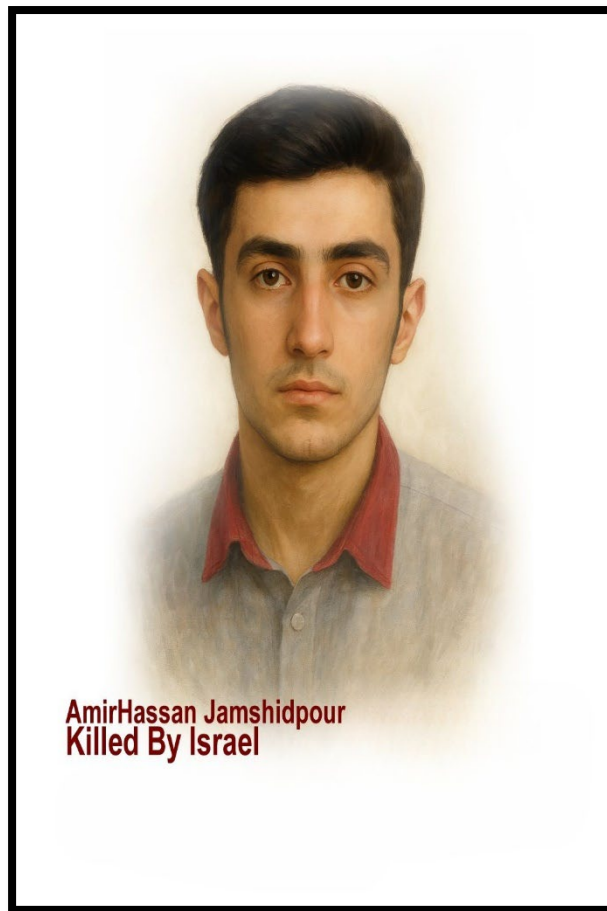

Title: The Killing of Yaser Ziyouri

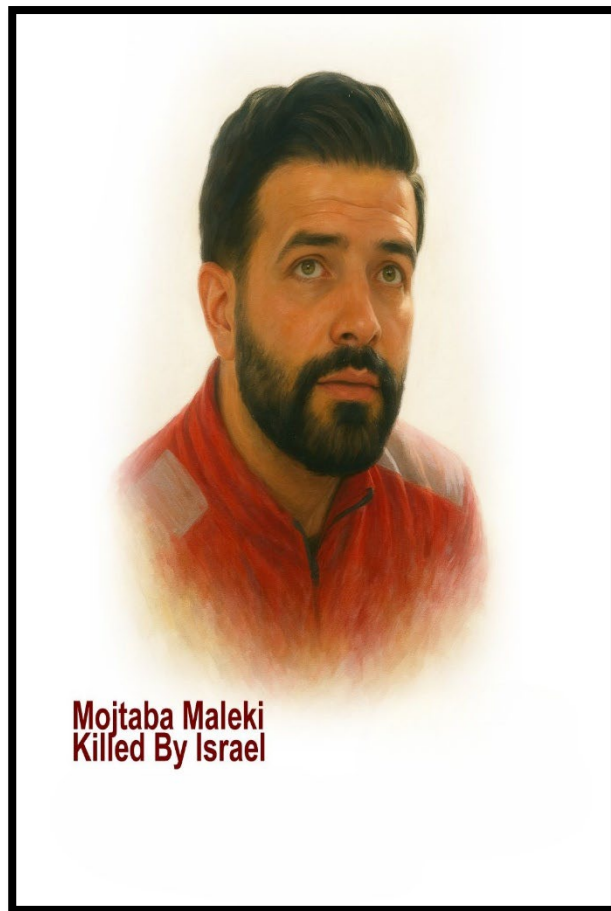

Title: The Killing of Amir Hassan JamshidPour

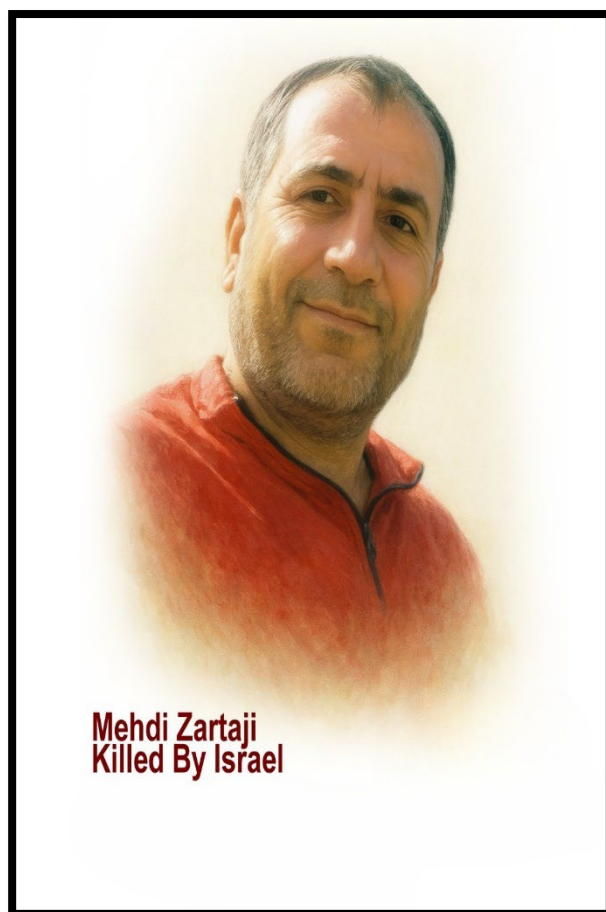
Description of the incident: Our story is about the second martyred Red Crescent aid worker who was martyred following a direct attack by the Zionist regime on a Red Crescent ambulance in Tehran, while the aid forces were performing their humanitarian duty and were not engaged in any military activity.

Title: The Killing of Mojtaba Maleki

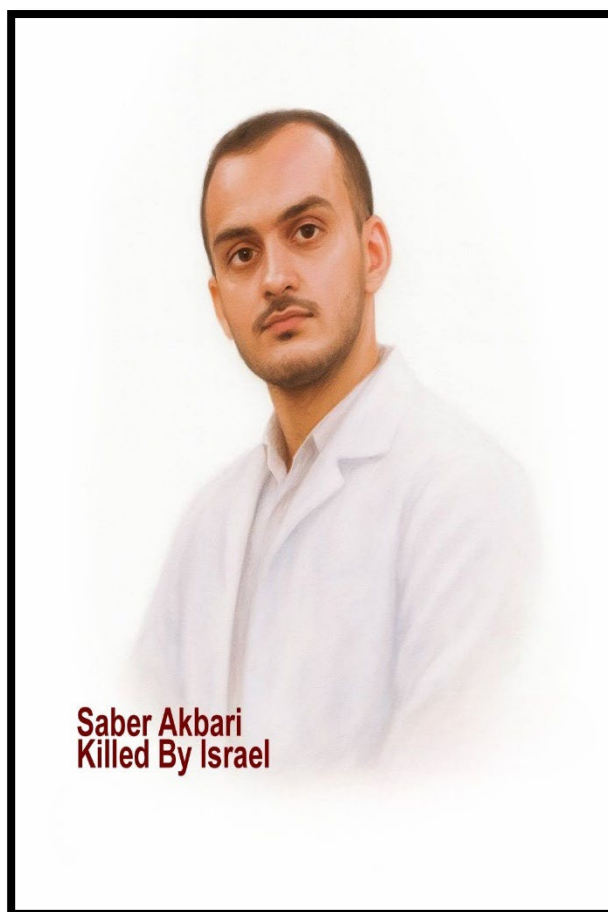
Description of the incident: A Red Crescent aid worker who was martyred following a cowardly and inhumane direct attack by Israel on a Red Crescent ambulance in Tehran.

Description of the incident: A martyred aid worker who had served the Iranian Red Crescent Society for many years, dedicating his life to helping others. At the time of his martyrdom, he was serving as the shift supervisor at the Gomichi Relief and Rescue Base in Osku County. He was killed on the first day of the airstrikes.

Title: The Killing of Saber Akbari

Description of the incident: A graduate of emergency medicine and a dedicated nurse living in Tehran was martyred while serving as a nurse alongside the defenders of the homeland following attacks by the Zionist regime.

Title: The Killing of Farzaneh Aghaei

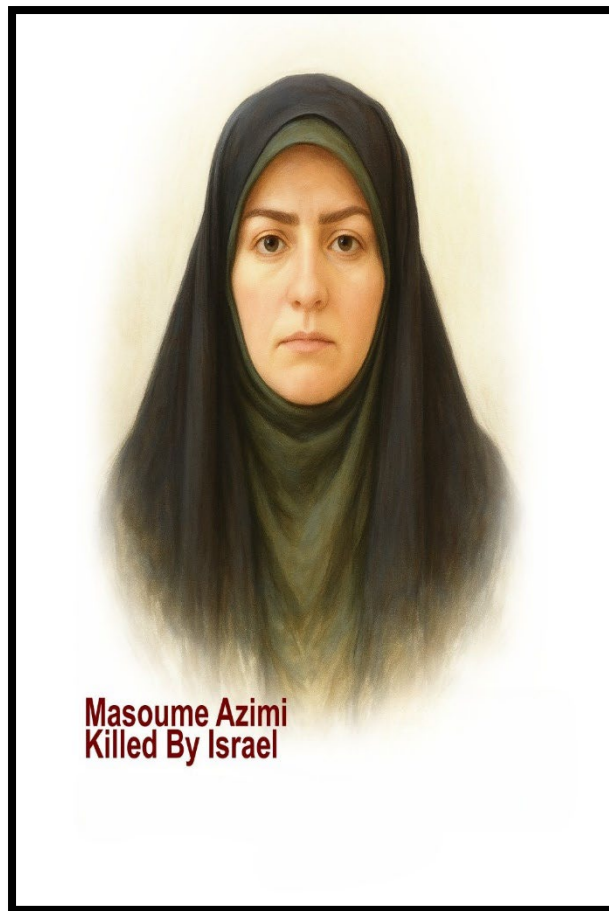
Description of the incident: A 51-year-old nursing expert and eye operating room technician was martyred at home on Mahnaz Street in Abbas Abad, Tehran, due to an explosion caused by an attack by the Zionist regime.

Title: The Killing of Fereshteh Bagheri

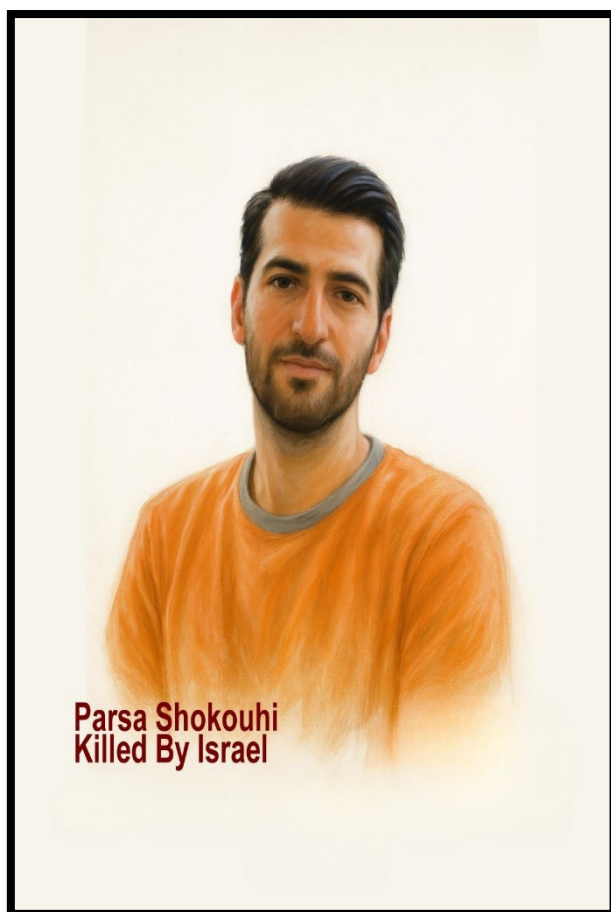
Description of the incident: Fereshteh Bagheri, daughter of the late Brigadier General Saeed Mohammad Bagheri, Chief of Staff of the Armed Forces of Iran, began her media activities with the Sacred Defense News Agency in 2019. She was martyred along with her father and mother during an attack by the Zionist regime.

Title: The Killing of Ma'soumeh Azimi

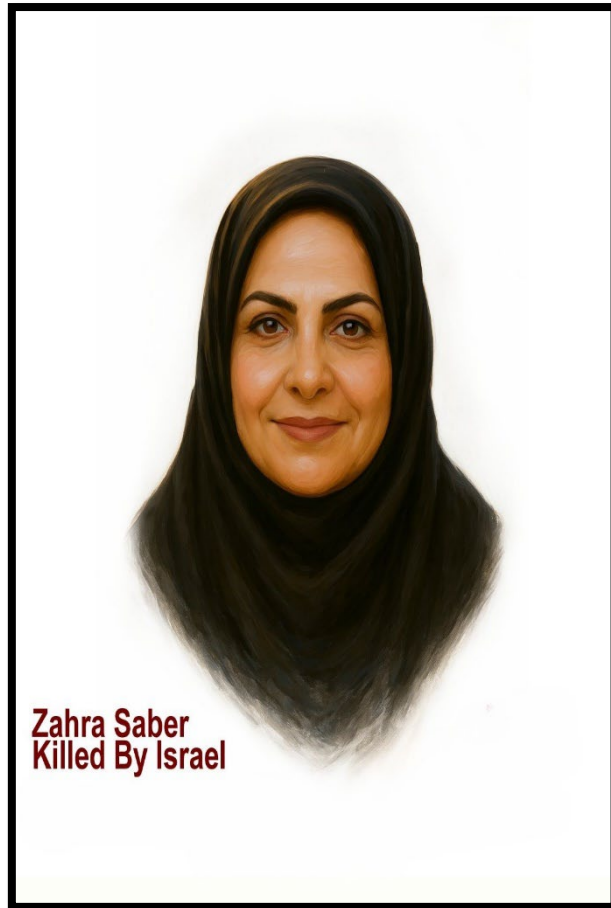
Description of the incident: During the attack on the IRIB Glass Building, Ma'soumeh Azimi, along with her colleague Nima Rajabpour, the news network's editor-in-chief, were present at their workplace when they were martyred. Ma'soumeh died as a result of the shockwave and blast caused by a missile strike.

Title: The Killing of Parsa Shokoohi

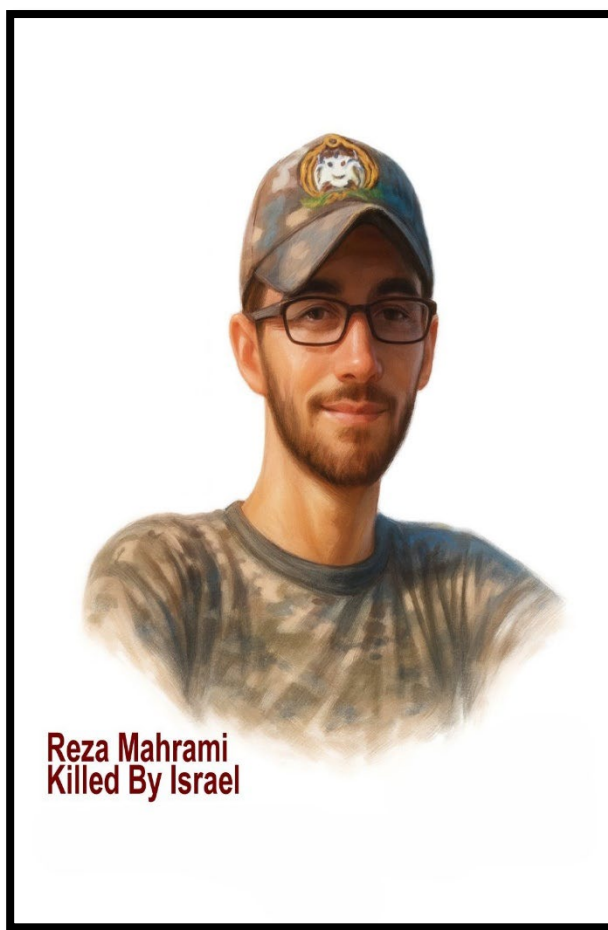
Description of the incident: Parsa Shokoohi, a young civilian from Qameshlu, was serving his mandatory military service when he was martyred during an attack by the Zionist regime in Tehran.

Title: The Killing of Zahra Saber

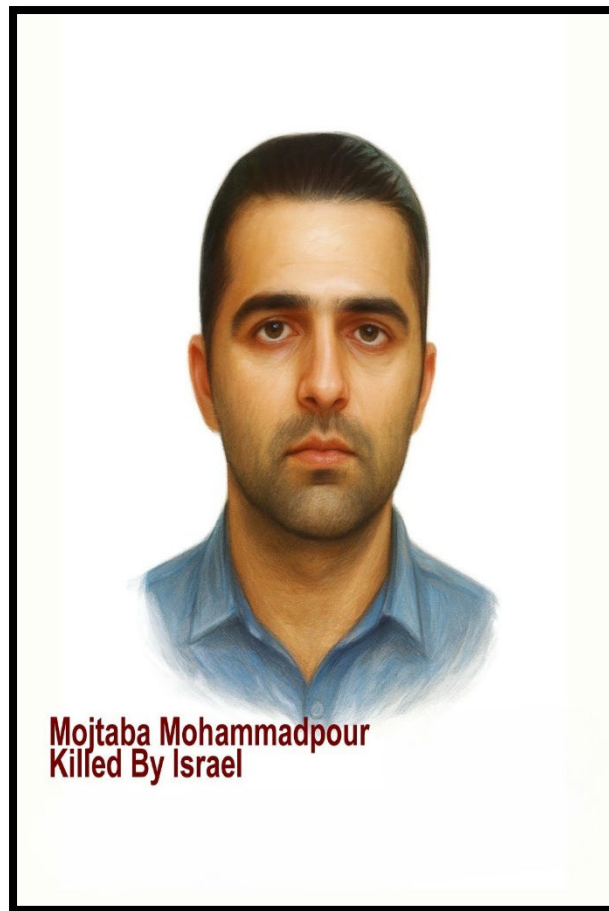
Description of the incident: Two days before her own martyrdom, Zahra Saber's son was also martyred. The Zionist regime, in its attempt to assassinate her husband, showed no mercy and also targeted her, their other children, and relatives.

Title: The Killing of Reza Moharrami

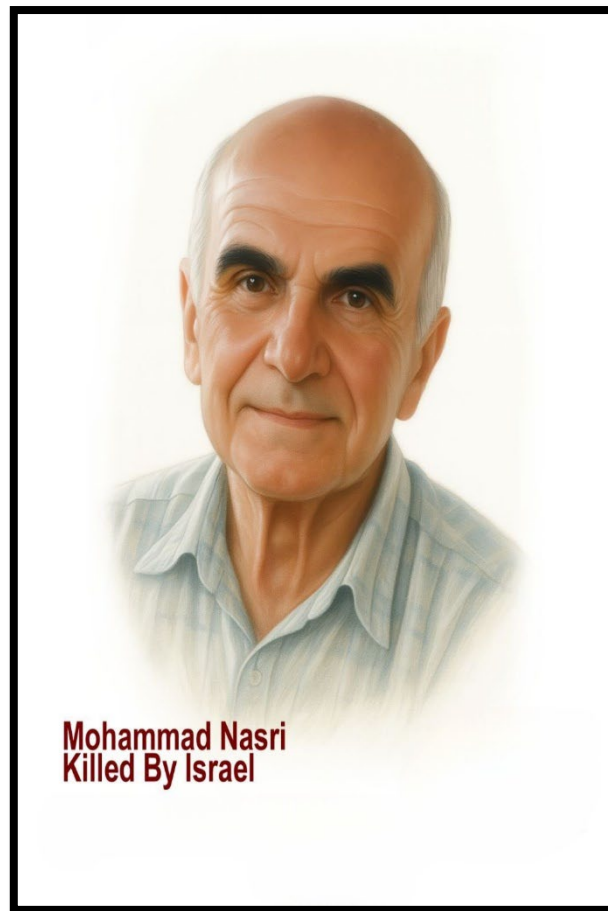
Description of the incident: An air defense soldier in Tabriz who, along with a number of the city's defenders, was martyred in one of Israel's attacks.

Title: The Killing of Mojtaba Mohammadpour

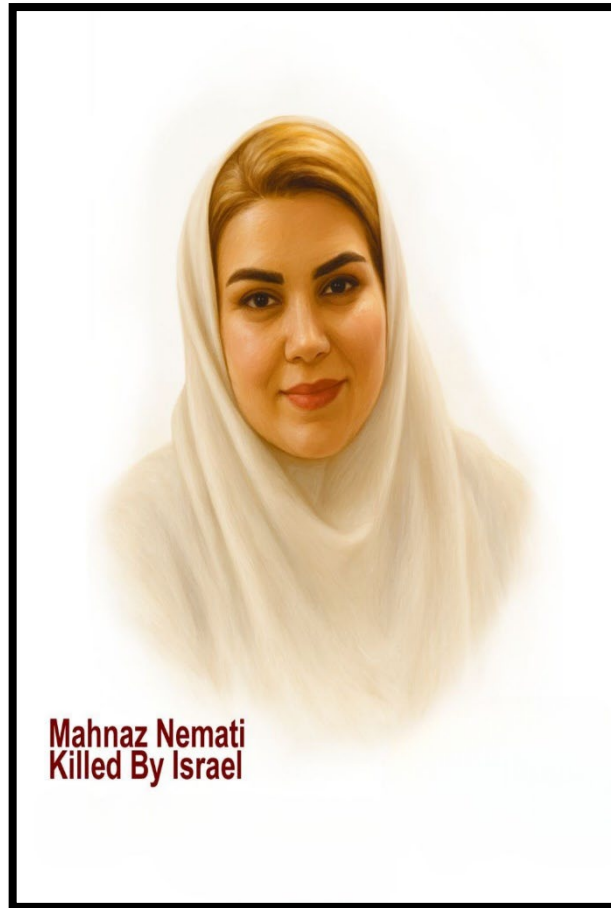
Description of the incident: Israel, while attempting to assassinate a nuclear scientist living in his neighborhood, targeted him. However, due to the explosion, this young father—who had been waiting for years to see his child—was also martyred.

Title: The Killing of Mohammad Nasri

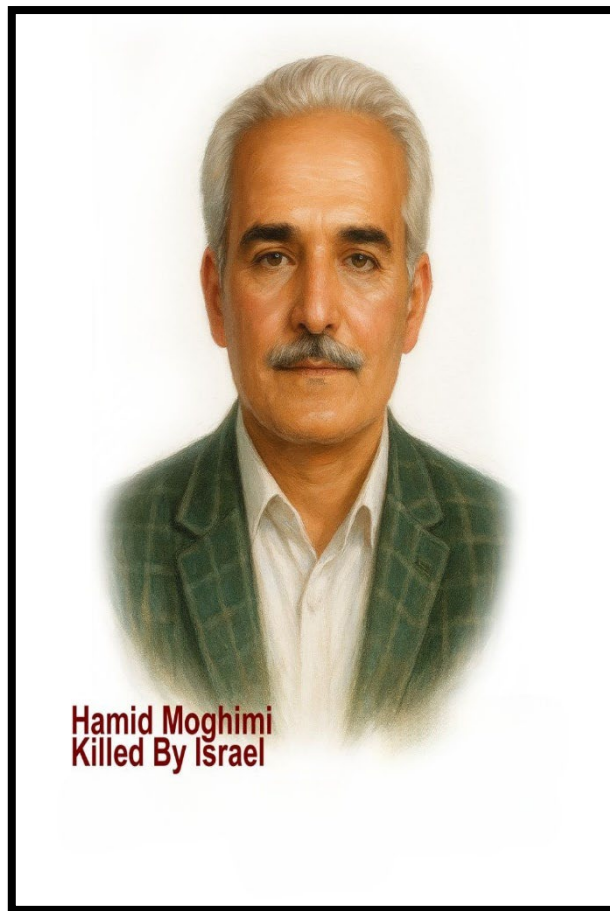
Description of the incident: Although Mohammad Naseri was from the Kurdistan region, he was martyred in Tehran during one of the Zionist regime's unlawful attacks.

Title: The Killing of Mahnaz Nemati

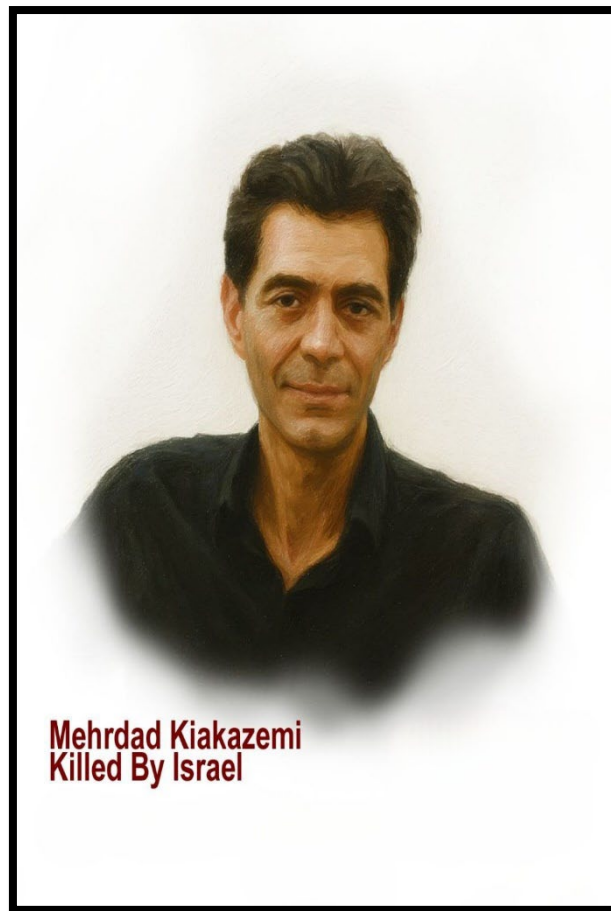
Description of the incident: Mahnaz Nemati, a compassionate nurse who, despite intense attacks, refused to leave her nursing duties, was martyred during Israeli attacks on residential areas in Tehran.



Document No. 43

Title: The Killing of Hamid Moghimi

Description of the incident: Israel, in its attempt to assassinate Dr. Mostafa Saadati Ameki (his son-in-law), targeted Hamid Moghimi, resulting in his martyrdom along with his wife and his daughter's family.



Document No. 44

Title: The Killing of Mehrdad Kia Kazemi

Description of the incident: Mehrdad Kia Kazemi, a driver who was able to save his wife and two children, was martyred in the Tajrish Square explosion.



Document No. 45

Attack on building in Shahid Chamran town

Description of the incident: Attack on A 14-story building in the Shahid Chamran town bore the brunt of the casualties in the first days of Israel's attack on Iran, including a large number of children and infants. However, the extent of the destruction was such that the first news of the number of victims was released a day later, stating that at least 60 people, including 20 children and infants, had been killed.



Document No. 46

Attack on an ambulance

Description of the incident: An ambulance was deliberately targeted by the Zionist regime in Tehran. As a result of this criminal attack, three Red Crescent aid workers were martyred while performing their humanitarian duties.



Document No. 47

Attack on an ambulance

Description of the incident: The Zionist Regime's Incident an ambulance carrying a patient was targeted in Najafabad. The ambulance, which was transporting a patient to the hospital on Shariati Street near Shahid Montazeri Hospital, was severely damaged by the drone strike, and the passengers of the ambulance, including the driver, the patient, and the patient's companion, were martyred.

Attack On Horse Stables

Description of the incident: The Zionist targeted a horse stable. In this attack, a horse stable was targeted, and the owner and workers, along with rescue workers, are helping the injured horses. A worker at the complex was also injured in this attack.

Description of the incident: The Israeli regime has continued its attacks on various areas, including Niavaran, Saadat Abad, Hemmat Highway, East to West, Valiasr Square, Haft Tir Square, Keshavarz Boulevard, Sohravardi Street, Jomhuri Street, Tehran Pars, 30 meters from the Air Force Station, and Tajrish.

Description of the incident: The Israeli regime continued its attacks on various areas, including Niavaran, Saadat Abad, Hemmat Highway, east to west, Valiasr Square, Haft Tir Square, Keshavarz Boulevard, Sohravardi Street, Pars Street, Republic of Tehran, 30 meters from Air Force and Tajrish.

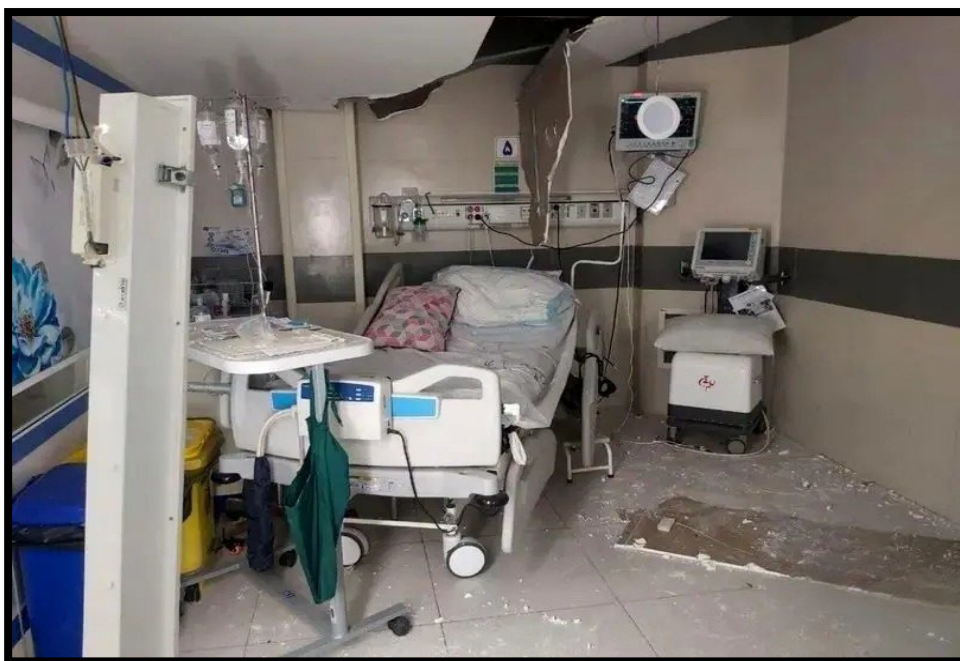
Description of the incident: "The highest number of civilian casualties was caused by the Israeli regime's attack on residential areas."

Attack on Shariati Street in Tehran

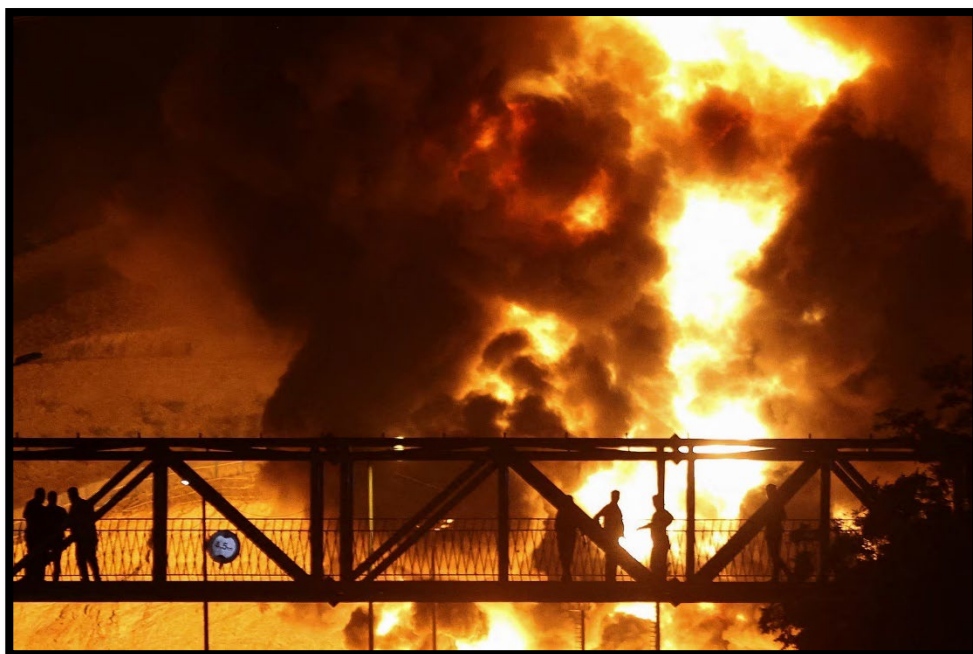
Description of the incident: "According to the Mayor of Tehran, 8,200 residential homes have been damaged as a result of the ongoing attacks carried out by the Zionist regime."

Description of the incident: "Valiasr Hospital, Motahari Burn Casualty Hospital, Khatam Welfare Center, Red Crescent Rehabilitation Center, Red Crescent Peace Building, the Intensive Care Unit of Kermanshah Farabi Hospital, and the Khuzestan 115 Emergency Center have also been affected by Israeli attacks."



Document No. 57

Attack on Shariati Street in Tehran

Description of the incident: During the Israeli attacks, explosions were reported across Tehran, including near military bases and neighborhoods where senior commanders lived. Eyewitnesses reported huge flames and a series of explosions.



Document No. 58

Attack on Civilian Areas

Description of the incident: In addition to explosions at the Natanz nuclear facilities in Isfahan Province, nuclear sites in Khondab, Khorramabad, Hamedan, and Tabriz were also targeted, resulting in the deaths of a group of nine military personnel, nuclear scientists, and several civilians. The buildings of nuclear sites, military installations, and residential areas were struck.



Document No. 59

Attack on the Iranian Broadcasting Corporation building

Description of the incident: "The IRIB building was targeted in an Israeli missile strike, resulting in the martyrdom or injury of several of its employees."



Document No. 60

Attack on the Farda Motors Factory

Description of the incident: Following an Israeli missile strike, the Farda Motors automobile manufacturing plant, located in the city of Borujerd in Lorestan Province, was targeted. As a result, two staff members lost their lives and dozens of others were injured. The incident has had serious consequences for the company's ongoing production activities.



Document No. 61

Attack on the Shahrn Oil Depot

Description of the incident: The Shahrn oil depot is one of the most important oil storage centers in Iran. Its proximity to the capital and major transportation networks has made it vital for maintaining Iran's fuel supply chain.



Document No. 62

Shiraz Electronics Industries

Description of the incident: In Shiraz, a projectile was also hit in the west of the city targeting an electronics facility. This incident was the result of a sabotage action by infiltrators affiliated with the Zionist regime.



Document No. 63

Attack on a civilian passenger car

Description of the incident: The Zionist regime, in its attack on Najafabad in Isfahan Province, targeted two private cars, killing a pregnant woman, her eight-month-old fetus, and her husband as they were traveling from Khomeini Shahr to Najafabad.
